Dear Friends and Supporters:

Welcome to NYC Health + Hospitals/Elmhurst's 2019 Gala at the beautiful Queens Museum! We look forward to this being a fun, memorable evening filled with a strong sense of community spirit, wonderful food, a silent auction, and raffle drive, all in support of two of our most important patient populations—our children and our seniors. Funds raised during this evening will be dedicated to services for our pediatric patients, who represent our best hopes for the future, and our geriatric patients, who remain a vital link between our present and our pasts.

Elmhurst has a long, proud tradition of providing excellent care to children and seniors. The founding institution of what would become Elmhurst Hospital began delivering babies in 1875 and made crucial strides in helping to reduce infant mortality throughout the 19th and early 20th centuries. When Elmhurst Hospital (then called the City Hospital at Elmhurst) moved to Queens in the 1950s, we began a thriving Pediatrics Department that today treats over 30,000 children annually through our Inpatient, Outpatient, and Pediatric Emergency services.

As the population of Queens has aged, Elmhurst's senior care services have evolved to include more healthcare programs specifically geared towards older adults. Our healthcare teams use innovative, collaborative approaches to treat common conditions affecting older adults such as hypertension, diabetes, depression and substance use disorders. This approach has yielded many positive results. Elmhurst has been recognized by national organizations such as the American Heart Association for our treatment of stroke patients and by the American Medical Association for our treatment of patients with hypertension.

We think it is crucial that our pediatric and geriatric patients continue to receive high-quality healthcare services in a comfortable, safe, and warm environment, and the financial help you are providing this evening will help make that possible. Thank you again for being here!

I must also take this opportunity to express my gratitude to those groups that work so closely with us in our mission to provide high-quality healthcare to all those who need it, including our Community Advisory Board under the enthusiastic leadership of Carlos Cortes, the Elmhurst Hospital Auxiliary, our local community boards, and many community-based organizations. I also want to thank our federal, state, and city elected officials for partnering with us to support the hospital. NYC Health + Hospitals/Elmhurst, which has been named by US News and World Report as one of the country's top hospitals in several key areas of medicine, is a 545-bed acute care facility and Level 1 Trauma Center located in the heart of Queens. It is one of the largest hospitals within the City of New York's public healthcare system and is located in one of the most culturally diverse communities in the world. Elmhurst offers translation services in more than 180 languages. Our patients come from across the globe, and we make every effort to alleviate cultural, social, and economic barriers to care to ensure that our patients have access to high-quality medical services, regardless of their ability to pay.

Founded in 1854 as City Hospital, Elmhurst is the second-oldest municipal hospital in the nation and has long been a pioneer in advancing healthcare innovation and the use of new medical technologies. We were the first hospital in the nation to use methods that substantially reduced puerperal or "childbed" fever, a major cause of maternal deaths in the early 20th century, and we played a large role in treating victims of the 1918 global flu epidemic. We also opened the country's first children's health center that same year. In 1964, a few years after we moved to Queens, the hospital became affiliated with the Mount Sinai Hospital and School of Medicine, which along with the introduction of modern equipment, resulted in a dramatic expansion of our programs and services.

The 1990s saw Elmhurst undergo renovations and upgrades of both inpatient and outpatient facilities. In recent decades we have continued to experience significant growth while adapting to the rapidly changing healthcare landscape. During the early stages of the HIV epidemic, Elmhurst opened one of the first clinics specifically aimed at treating those infected. In 2003, Elmhurst became the first public hospital to perform laparoscopic surgery using the da Vinci robotic surgical system.

We became a designated Stroke Center in 2004, and Elmhurst was the first hospital in Queens to be approved to perform elective angioplasty. As our community has grown and expanded, so have we. In 2008, we opened The Hope Pavilion, a state-of-the-art cancer treatment facility, and in 2016 we opened the Women's Pavilion, a clinic dedicated to caring for pregnant women in a safe and welcoming environment. In 2017, we opened a UAC-certified ExpressCare Clinic, making us one of the first Health + Hospitals facilities to have an Urgent Care Center for non-emergent cases. Earlier this year, to accommodate our large inpatient behavioral health

service, we opened a renovated unit on our 11th floor designed to meet the special needs of geriatric and frail patients dealing with both mental and physical health challenges. This past summer we opened redesigned Medical Primary Care and Adolescent Clinics, and broke ground for the construction of an Ambulatory Surgery Center, which is scheduled to open in 2021.

We are currently planning large-scale renovations of several other departments, including our Emergency Department and Labor and Delivery Suites. The hospital will also soon begin a construction project for space to accommodate a bi-plane unit, which can generate real-time three-dimensional views enabling physicians to perform complex scans of the brain in stroke patients. The introduction of this technology will allow us to become a Comprehensive Stroke Center and better serve the needs of our community.

Throughout our long history, Elmhurst has received a host of awards in recognition of the outstanding care we provide. We are especially proud of having been named a top hospital for stroke care for several years in a row by the American Heart Association/American Stroke Association, a top hospital for the treatment of hypertensive patients by the American Medical Association, certifications for our Hip and Knee, Stroke, Palliative Care, and Methadone programs from The Joint Commission, being recognized as "Leader in LGBTQ Healthcare" by the Human Rights Campaign, and having won designation as a "Baby-Friendly" facility through an initiative sponsored by the World Health Organization and UNICEF.

As we plan our future, we continue to think about ways to innovate and improve the care provide. Your support tonight will ensure that we can embrace that future with the resources we need to continue our critical mission of providing high-quality and compassionate care.

HONOREE
CARL F. MATTONE, PRESIDENT & CEO
CFM DEVELOPMENT, LLC

As President and CEO of CFM Development, Carl Mattone is in charge of general oversight of all development projects and oversees all aspects of construction coordination.



Mr. Mattone has been in the construction and real estate business since 1981 when he formed a maintenance and contracting business and acted as the construction supervisor on numerous development projects in Brooklyn and Queens. In 1985, he joined forces with his father, Joseph M. Mattone, Sr. in Mattone Group Ltd. as Vice President of Project Development. In that capacity, he was in charge of evaluating potential projects and overseeing the construction of those projects. In addition, he served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Queens County Builders Association from 1986 to 1987.

In 1990, Mr. Mattone was appointed Chief Operating Officer of the Mattone Group and was responsible for both the development and management of the organization. In 1995, he was appointed President and saw opportunities to develop shopping centers and movie theaters. Mr. Mattone was responsible for the construction of a 30,000 square foot retail/office complex in College Point, Queens and recently oversaw a 460,000 square foot theater and retail complex in Jamaica, Queens. Other duties included negotiating all retail leases, coordinating tenant fit out, and negotiating all architectural, engineering, and general contracts. Mr. Mattone also oversaw the management and maintenance of all properties.

In 2018, Mr. Mattone ventured out on his own and created CFM Development, LLC, with his daughter Irene and son Carl, carrying the same traditions and work ethic over to his new company.

Mr. Mattone attended Holy Cross High School in Flushing, Queens and Iona College in New Rochelle, New York.

HONOREE
BURTON P. DRAYER, MD

Burton Paul Drayer, MD, is the Charles M. and Marilyn Newman Professor and System Chair of the Department of Radiology for The Mount Sinai Health System and the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai as well as the CEO of the Mount Sinai Doctors Faculty Practice and Dean for Clinical Affairs. He previously served as the President of The Mount Sinai Hospital from November 2003 to September 2008.



Dr. Drayer's academic appointments began in 1977 as Associate Professor of Radiology at the University of Pittsburgh Health Center. From 1979 to 1986, Dr. Drayer was faculty at Duke University Medical Center where he became Professor of Radiology and Assistant Professor of Medicine (Neurology). He is Board Certified in both Radiology/Neuroradiology and Neurology. In 1986, he was appointed Chair of the Division of Neuroimaging Research-Education at the Barrow Neurological Institute in Phoenix Arizona where he remained until 1995 and also became Chair of Radiology at St. Joseph's Hospital. In 1995, Dr. Drayer moved to his present Radiology position at the Mount Sinai Medical Center.

Internationally known for his research using anatomic, physiologic, and functional imaging of the aging brain, brain iron (the first to define the normal and abnormal presence of iron using MRI), neurodegenerative disorders, brain infarction, xenon enhanced CT for measuring regional cerebral blood flow (first described its potential, feasibility, and application), MR angiography, multiple sclerosis, and intrathecal contrast media toxicity, Dr. Drayer has over 200 publication in major journals as well as multiple book chapters. He has been on many editorial boards and was Editor of Neuroimaging Clinics of North America from 1990 to 2005. He is also well recognized as an expert in the development of outpatient imaging facilities, imaging center design, and advanced imaging equipment. Dr. Drayer also serves on the Board of Directors of Hospitals Insurance Company (HIC), a malpractice liability insurance captive.

Dr. Drayer has been a leader in the major national and international Radiology societies. He was on the Board of Directors of the American Society of Neuroradiology (ASNR) from 1990 to 2000 and was ASNR President (1996-1997). He was also a founding member and the inaugural Chairman of the Research Foundation of the ASNR (1995-2001). He was on the Board of Directors of the Radiological Society of North America (RSNA) as the Liaison for the Annual Meeting and IT from 2003 to 2008, Chairman of the Board in 2009, and President Elect and President in 2010 and 2011. He was Chairman of the RSNA Research and Education Foundation from 2015-2016. Additionally, Dr. Drayer was on the Board of Chancellors of the American College of Radiology (ACR) from 2009-2015 and Chaired the ACR Panel on Neurologic Imaging Appropriateness Criteria from 1994-2003. He also served on the Board of Directors of the Academy of Radiology Research (ARR) from 1995 to 2000 and 2009 to 2012.

Among the honors presented to Dr. Drayer were the ASNR Cornelius Dyke (1977) and Outstanding Paper (1978, 1981) awards, the Jacobi Medallion of the Mount Sinai Medical Center (2009), honorary fellowship in the Royal College of Surgeons, Ireland (2011), honorary member of the European Society of Radiology (2012), and the Gold Medal of the ASNR in 2011 and the RSNA in 2016. Dr. Drayer is a fellow of both the American Academy of Neurology and the American College of Radiology. His career has been dedicated to enhancing the educational, clinical, research and administrative platform for his associates at Mount Sinai as well as the national and international community of radiologists and imaging scientists.

RENEE SPIEGEL, M.D. , DIRECTOR OF SURGERY AT NEW YORK CITY HEALTH + HOSPITALS/ELMHURST

Dr. Renee Spiegel is the Director of Surgery at New York City Health + Hospitals/Elmhurst.

Dr. Renee Spiegel graduated from the University Of Arizona School Of Medicine and completed her General Surgery residency at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. She joined the full time faculty at Elmhurst in 1992 and immediately became a productive and invaluable member of the team leading efforts in both clinical care and resident education.



Dr. Spiegel is a senior member of the hospital leadership team and takes responsibility for many of our initiatives in quality and performance improvement. Under her stewardship accomplishments have included a new Universal Protocol preventing wrong patient and wrong site surgery, a Colon Bundle that has reduced surgical site infections and continued achievements in the Surgical Care Improvement Program that has reduced post-operative complications including infections, DVT and sudden cardiac events.

Under Dr. Spiegel's leadership of the Surgical Department since 2014 the hospital received accreditation as a Level 1 Trauma Center from the American College of Surgeons. Specialty surgery has been expanded to include Colorectal Surgery, Surgical Oncology, Hand Surgery, and Robotic Surgery. Dr. Spiegel is the President of the Medical Executive Committee and the Elmhurst Faculty Practice. New, upcoming initiatives include improving OR flow as well as planning for the hospital's new Ambulatory Surgery Center.

Dr. Spiegel is a passionate teacher of medical students and residents. The Mount Sinai Surgical Residents continue to recognize her for outstanding mentorship and teaching.
